Public Information Period Questions

1. Please explain the increase in the water bills? Are there initiatives in place to assist residents with their water bills, late fees or other household utilities?

City Council has always considered any increase in rates charged to our customers an issue of concern. With that in mind, City Council, along with the City Manager's Staff in Public Works / Utilities have held Work Sessions to discuss projected rate increases for water and sewer as recent as April, 2014. The FY14 Budget outlined a five-year plan to curtail rate increases at the bare minimum and City Council has only supported a minimum increase this past year and the year we are in now.

Rate increases discussed and adopted are to cover operating expenses to continue providing good, safe, and clean water and wastewater to our citizens. Just this year alone, the cost to purchase water from ARWA and for wastewater treatment from SCWA has increased 12%. Water and sewer rates will continue to increase due to federal and state regulations requiring the City to maintain and replace aging infrastructure through its Capital Improvement Program.

With regard to assistance to customers in need of help paying their bills, our Billing Office located in the first floor of the City Hall Annex Building at 103 W. Tabb Street has an updated list of possible assistance groups (examples include City Social Services, local Churches, Good Will, etc.). Their phone number is 804-733-2349 and they stand by to assist any and all customers of our City.

The City's Department of Social Services also offers Fuel Assistance. The purpose of Fuel Assistance is to help eligible households with the cost of home heating. It is designed to help offset this expense rather than to pay all of it. This program can also help with furnace re-starts, late charges, delivery charges, installation charges, and connection or re-connection fees.

To be eligible for Fuel Assistance, there are certain income guidelines and living arrangements that must be met. The household must be responsible for paying the heating bill. The Petersburg Department of Social Services accepts applications from the second Tuesday in October through the second Friday in November.
